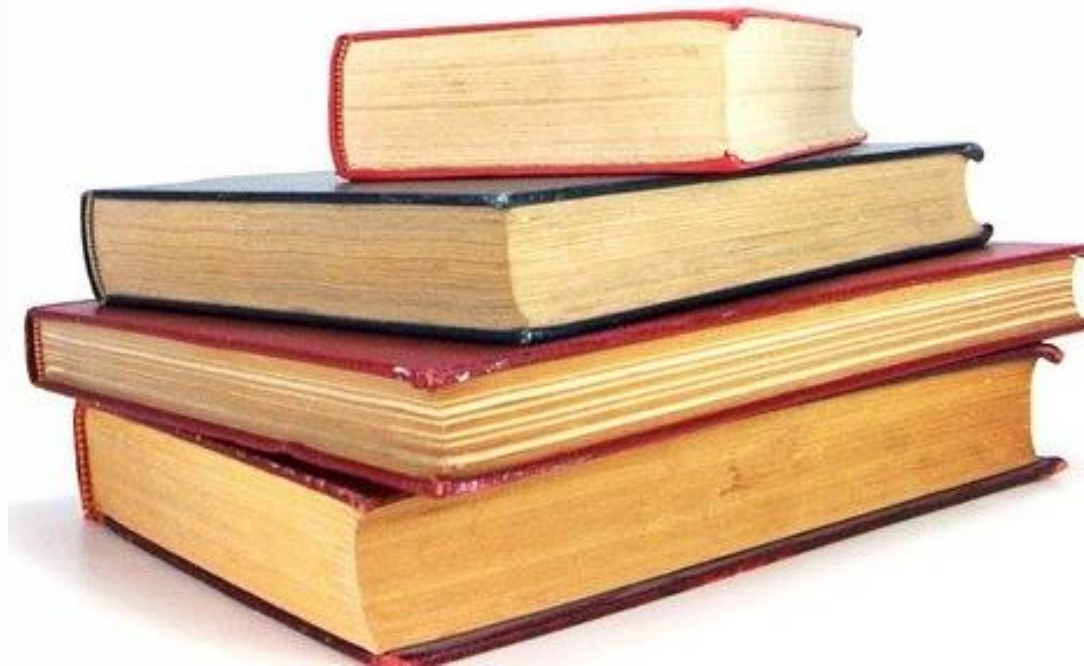


Your host, Alison Meredith:
